Fairhaven's Resident Council began 2025 by welcoming Rich Schilt from Prairie Village to the council. He is beginning his first term with interest and enthusiasm. Please utilize his interest and talk with him about your ideas or concerns, as well as his.

Jasmyne from Dining Services gave a brief update regarding plans for exciting ventures from the kitchen, including the Resident Tea social on Thursday, January 23 as well as others coming down the way. Some additional tasting opportunities with food vendors starting soon, new offerings from behind the kitchen doors, and a happy, excited kitchen staff crew. Keep your taste buds active and ready to jump for joy.

Paul brought the council up to date with progress on the renovated central 3rd and 4th floors, with most of the 4th floor rooms occupied or spoken for, a tentative plan for the third floor to begin occupancy soon, and the 2nd floor looking to be complete hopefully in the next month or so. Opening these three spaces means a little creative staffing to utilize our current staff, to not short areas which need consistent staff, and to be ready to add new staff as the need arises.

Nelda gave the Prairie Village Moment review of the water retention ponds dotted around Prairie Village, their purposes, and the abundance of wildlife to see and watch. Included are deer, turkeys, rabbits, groundhogs, squirrels, fish in the ponds, and many assorted birds. Anybody for some skunks?

Henry Malo was recognized for his many terms of service on the Council with a certificate of appreciation and voices of acknowledgment. Henry had some words of encouragement, wisdom, and reflection on his time with Council, and especially his time with Fairhaven, which he praises as the best around and superior place to live.

Two other reports were made as updates. The annual Employee Christmas Fund is off and running again, healthy and very appreciated by staff. Karen and Neil are going to continue managing the fund with their golden fingers as they watch it grow and report back to the committee.

The Suggestion Box located at the Fairhaven main mailbox area has been resting over most of the holiday season. Please remember to utilize the box as another way to bring your ideas to the Fairhaven administration and the Resident Council. The suggestion box is available 24 hours a day, has paper and pens next to it for your convenience and use, and is checked a couple times a week. Maintenance has been having an uptick with plugged drains and garbage disposals. Placing wrong items down the drains and/or garbage disposal is very costly and can damage the internal plumbing.

What to avoid

Egg shells: Can break into small pieces that are hard to flush out, or the membrane can wrap around the blades and cause clogs

Pasta or rice: Can absorb water and create a thick paste that can clog the drain

Fibrous vegetables: Can bind up around the blades, including rhubarb, asparagus, celery, chard, artichokes, kale, and lettuce

Paper towels, napkins, or tissues: Don't break down easily and can cause clogs

Kitty litter: The material will not break down and clog the drain

What to put in

Soft or liquid foods: Leftover food from your plate, as well as soft foods

Ice cubes: Can help remove food bits from the blades Citrus rinds: Can be beneficial for the disposal Dish soap: Can be put down the disposal Cold water: Can be poured down the disposal



Stroke

- Sudden numbness or weakness in the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body
- Sudden confusion or trouble understanding speech
- Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes
- Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, or loss of balance or coordination
- Sudden severe headache with no known cause

Heart attack

- Pain or discomfort in the chest
- Lightheadedness, nausea or vomiting
- Jaw, neck or back pain
- Discomfort or pain in arm or shoulder
- Shortness of breath
